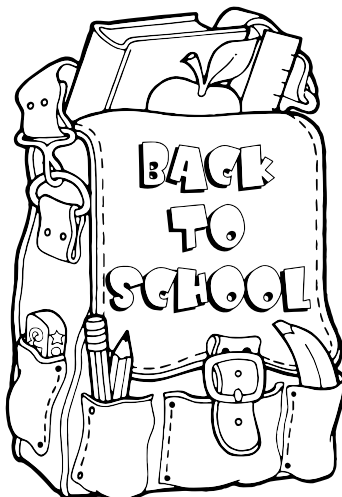

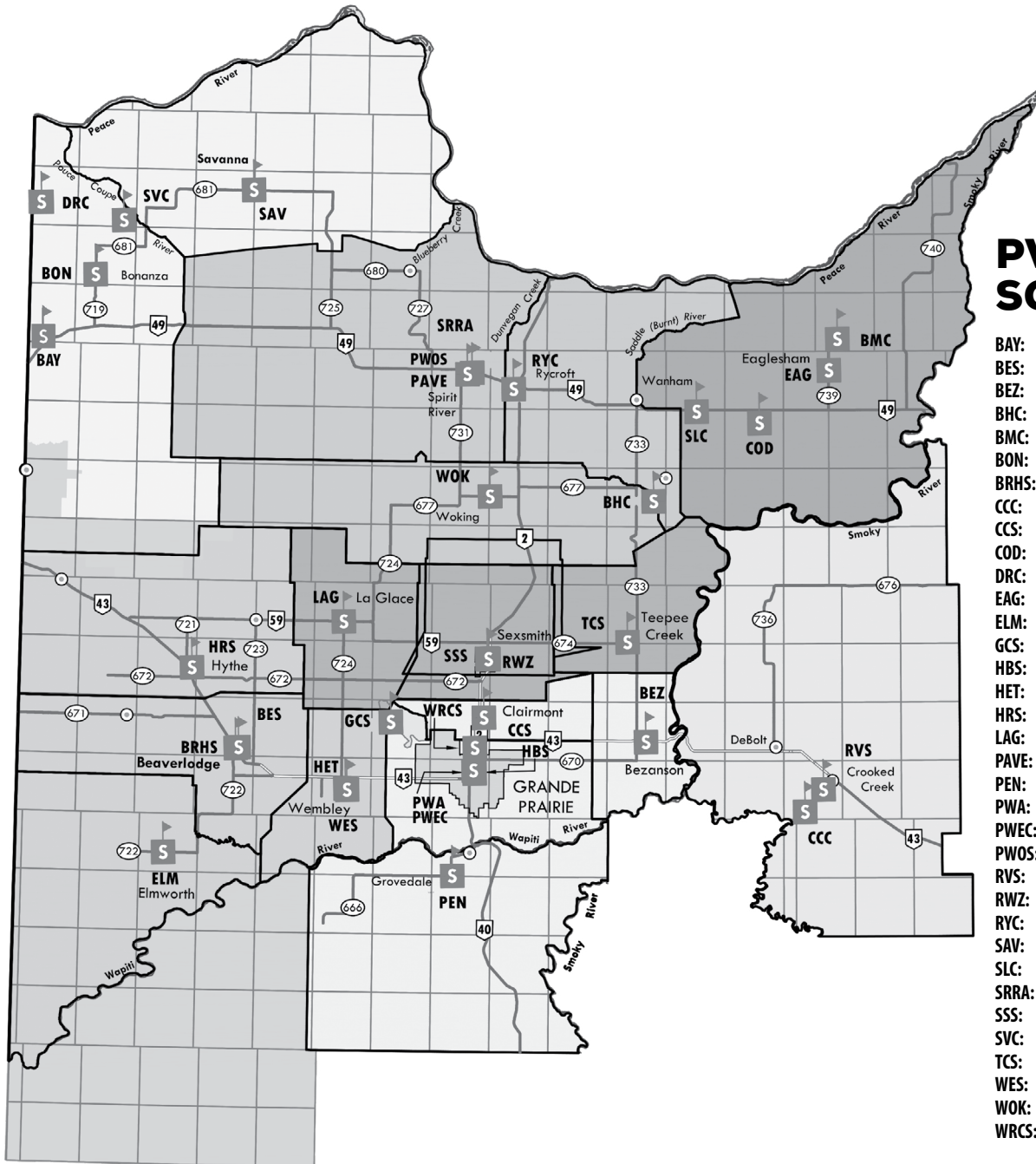
Colour your way around Peace Wapiti Public School Division!

Peace Wapiti Public School Division (PWPSD) provides service to approximately 6,000 Kindergarten to Grade 12 students in 35 schools, including nine Hutterite colony schools, two outreach schools, an online school, and educational programming at a group home facility.

PWPSD also provides schooling for students from Horse Lake First Nation and Kelly Lake Métis settlement.



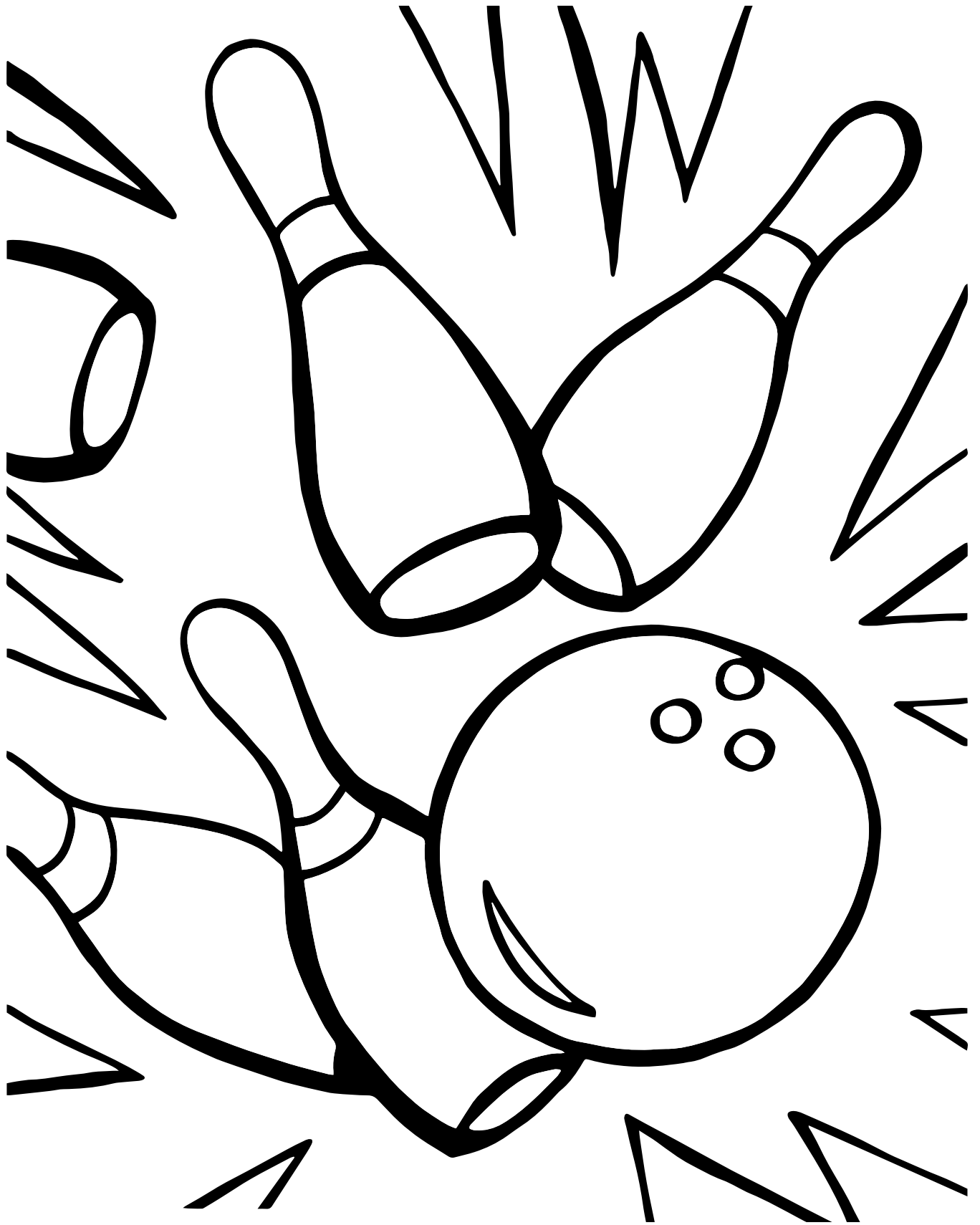
Here's a map of Peace Wapiti Public School Division.

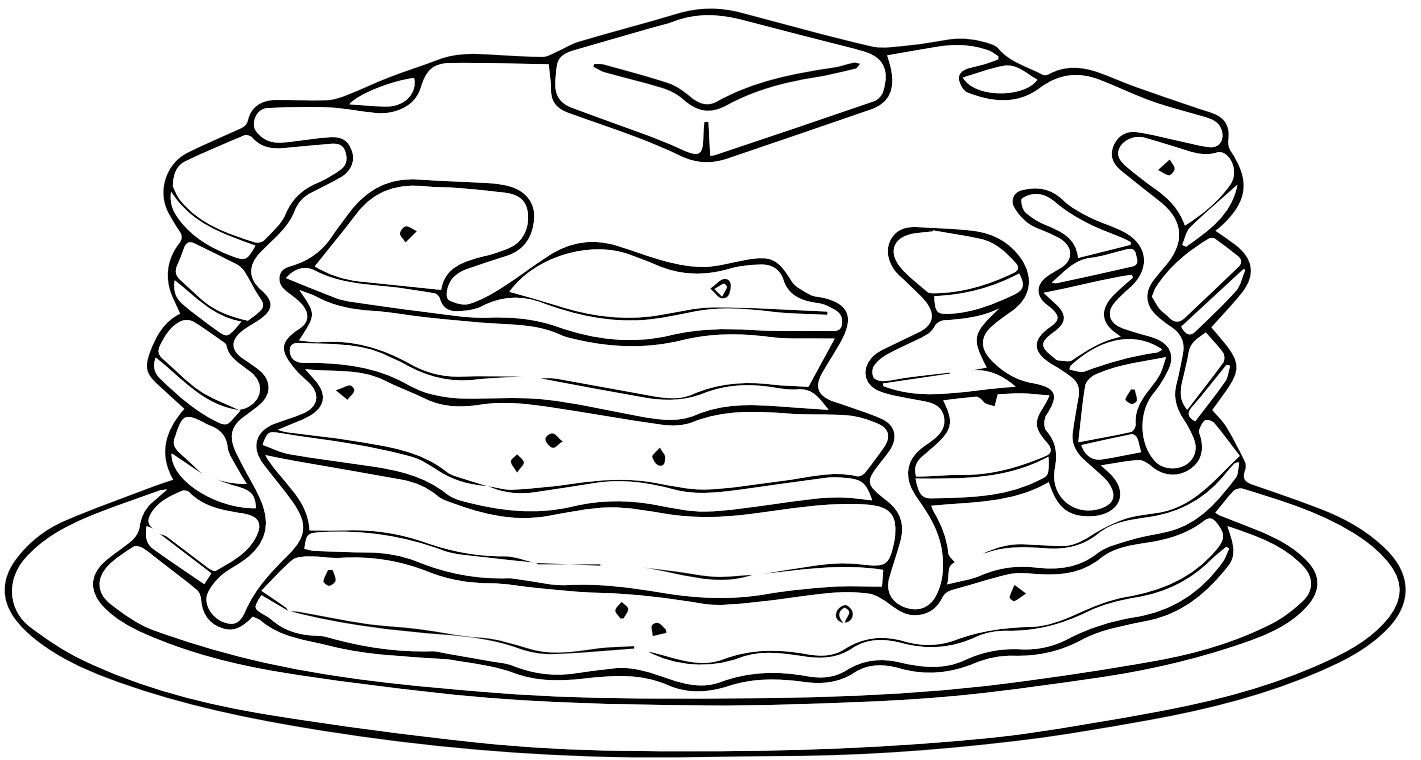

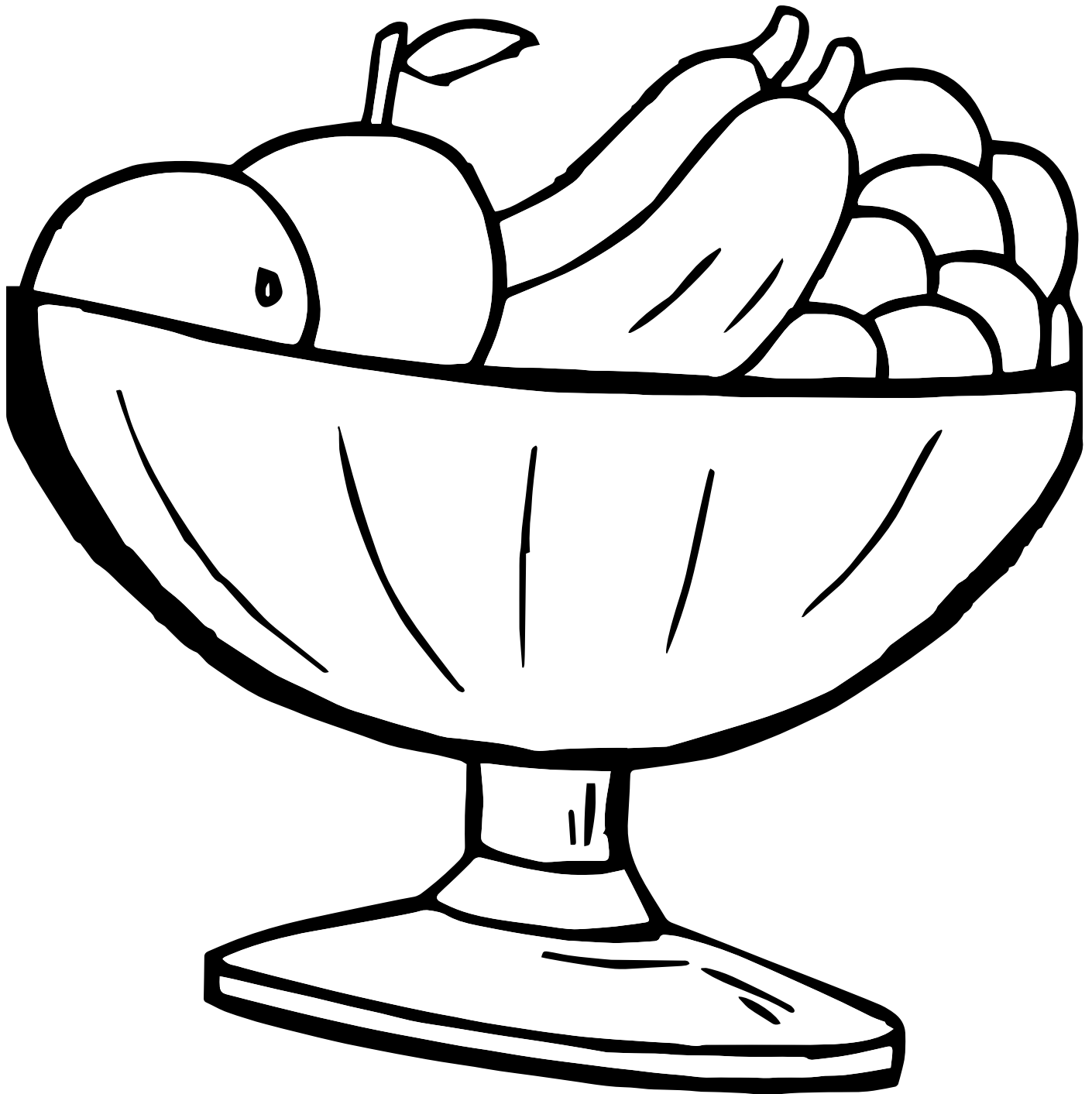

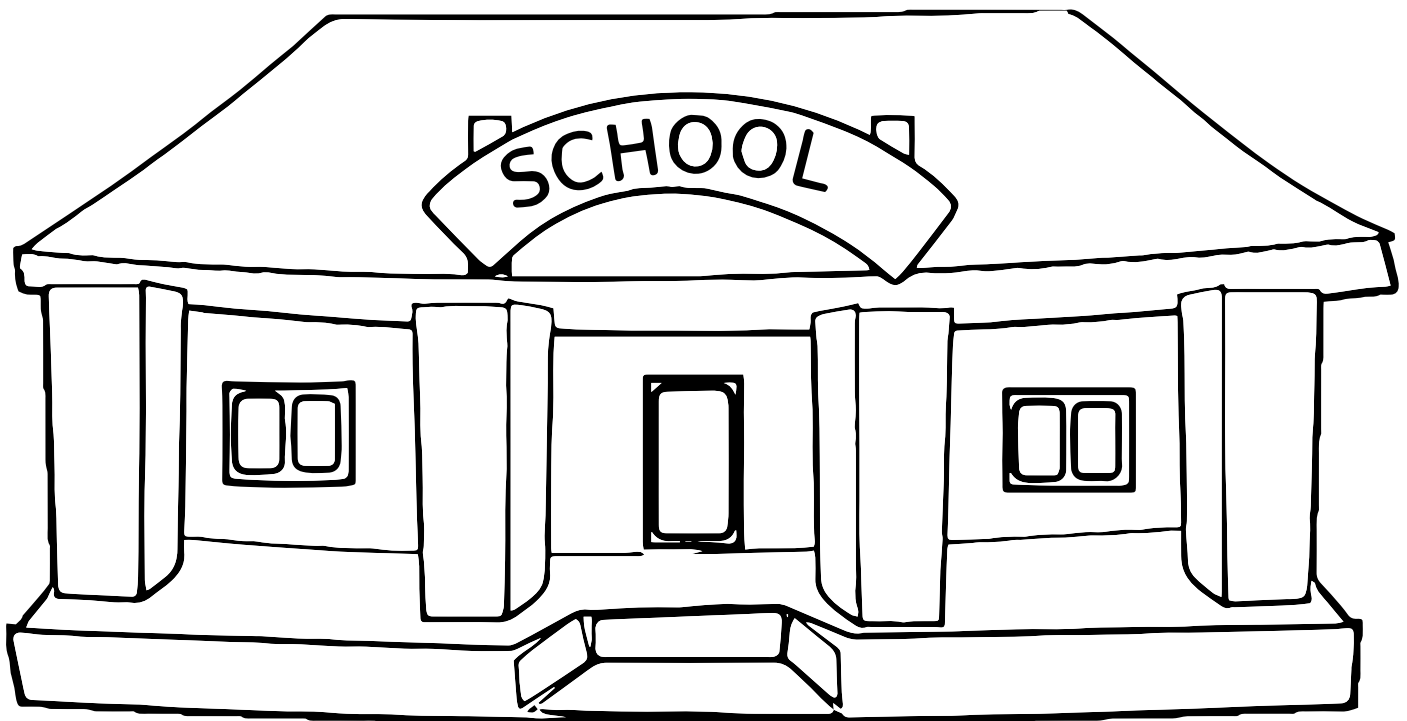

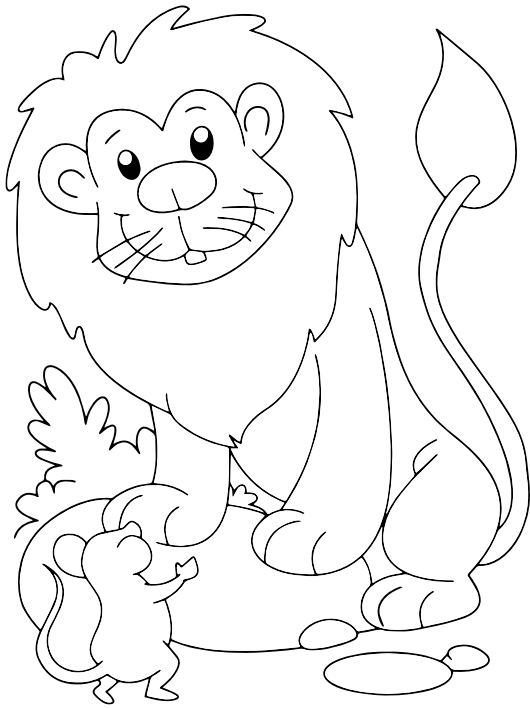

Clairmont Community School hosts an annual Fine Arts Night to showcase student talents.

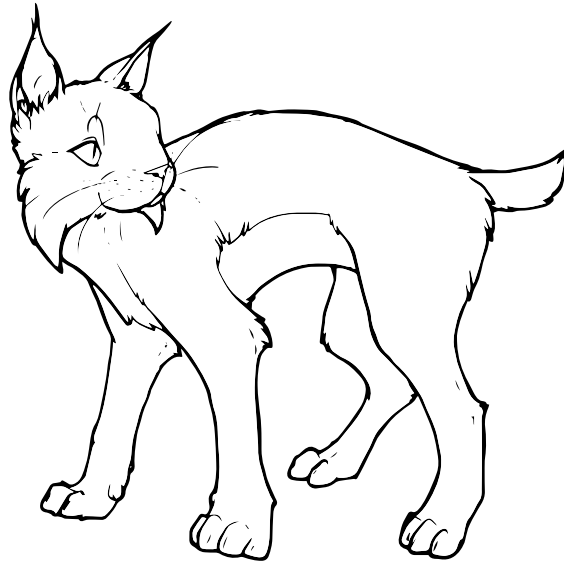

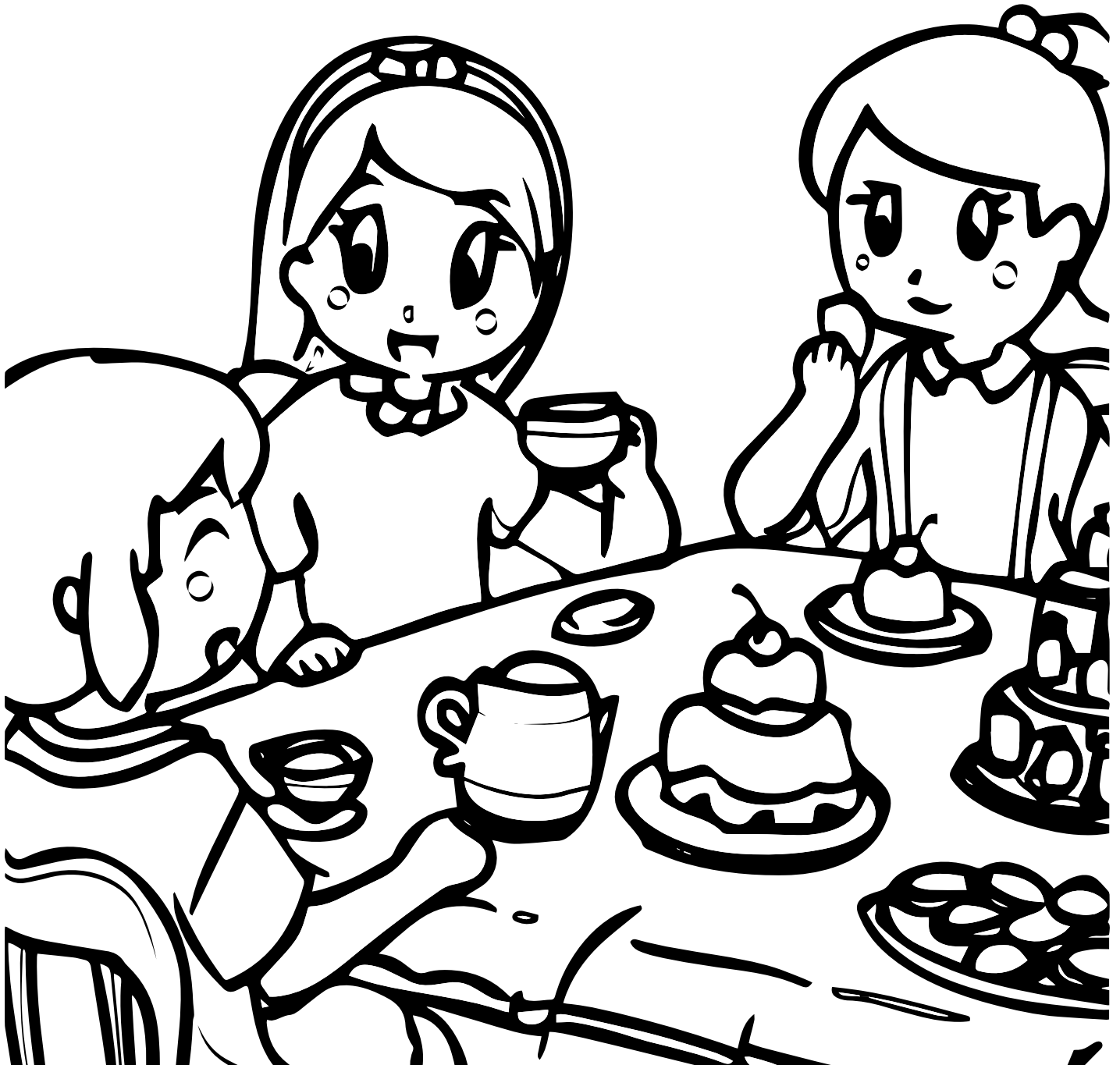

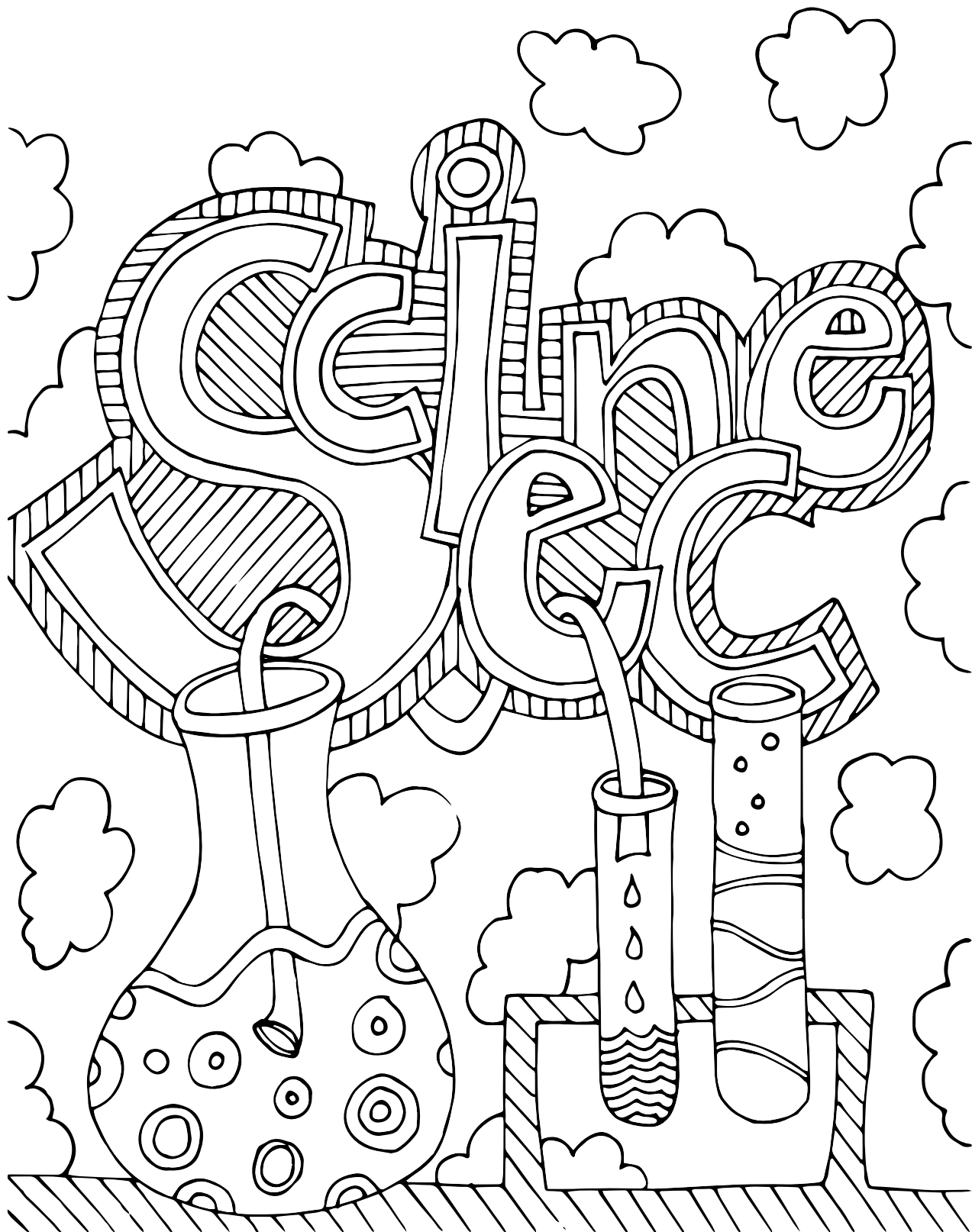

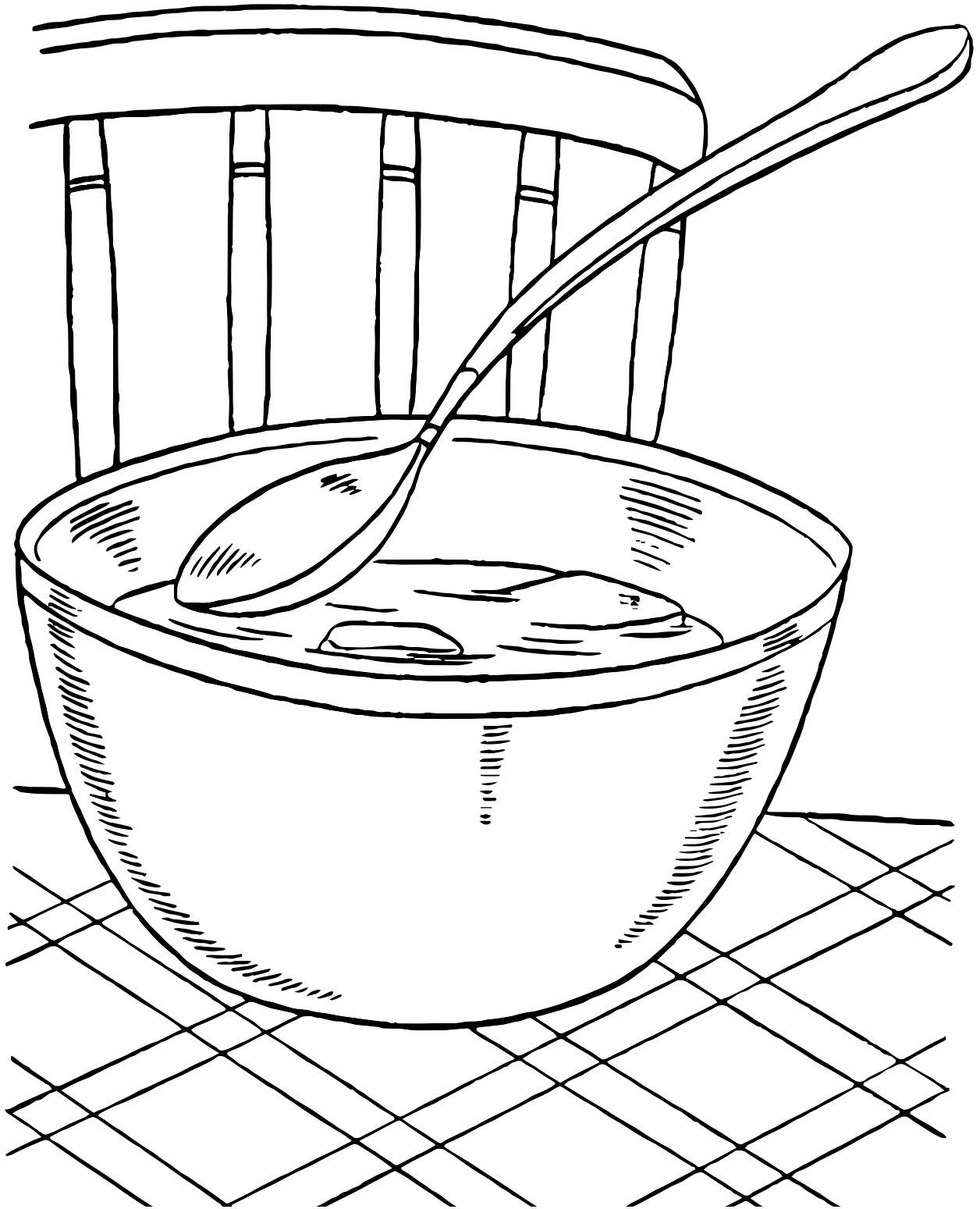

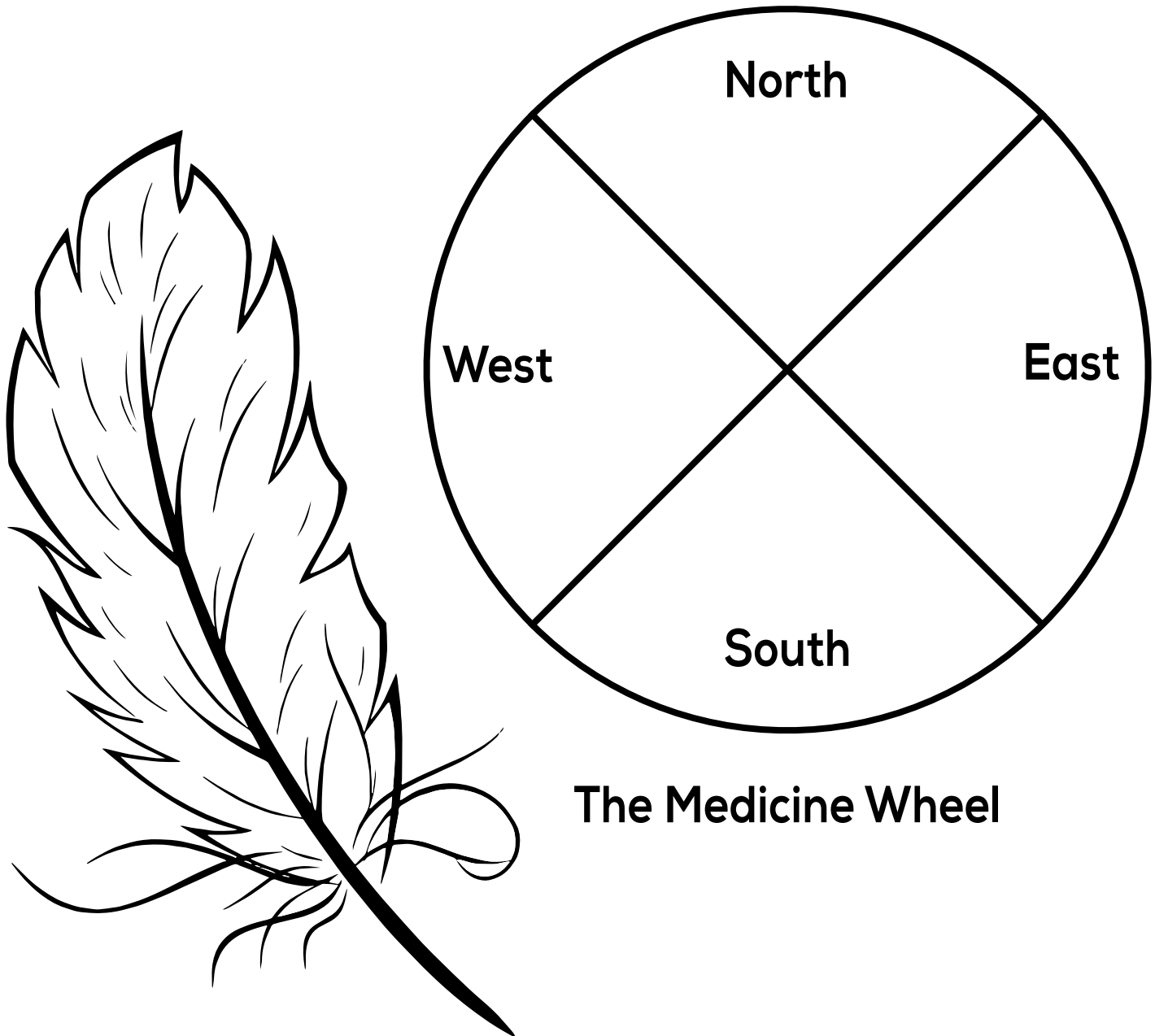

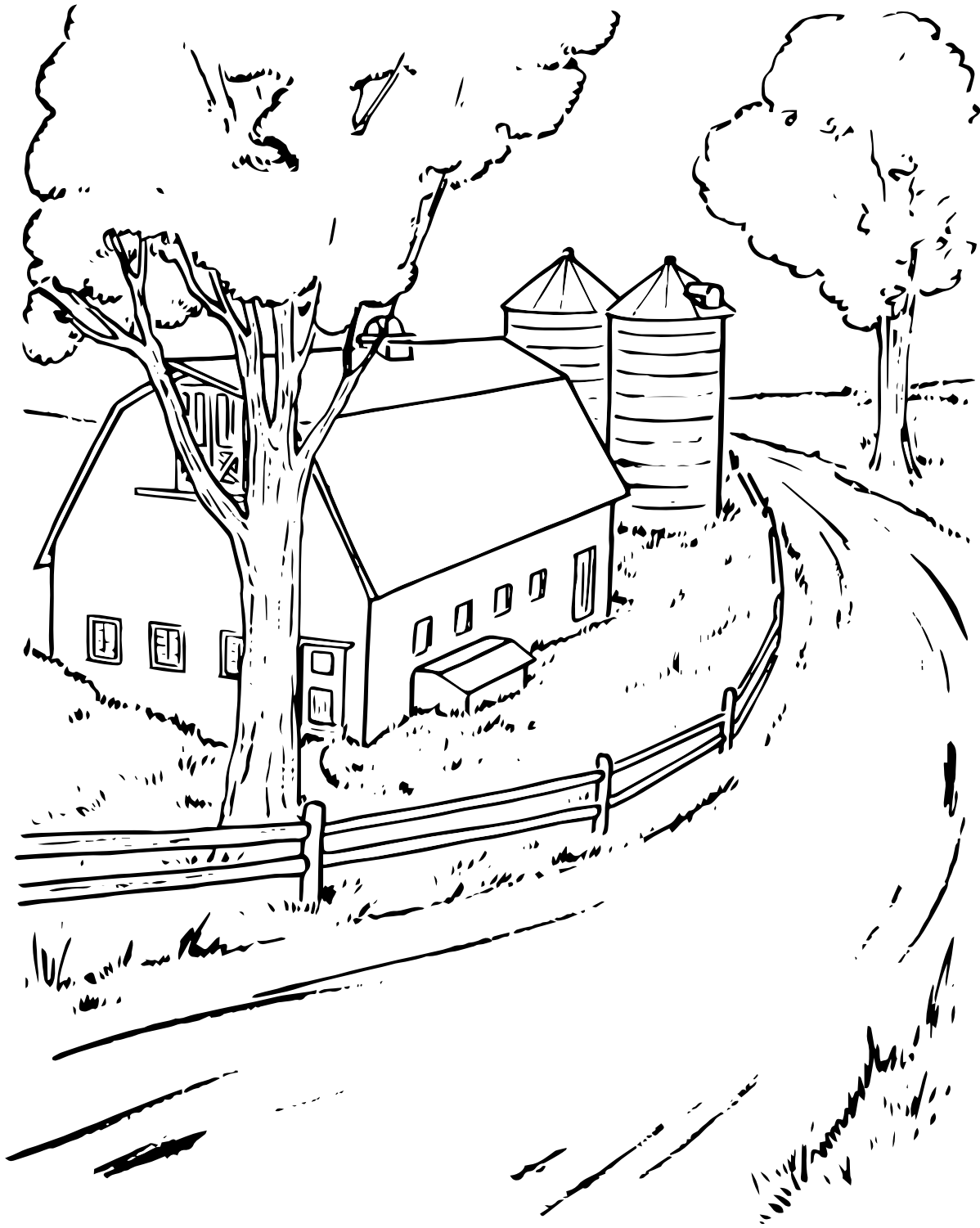

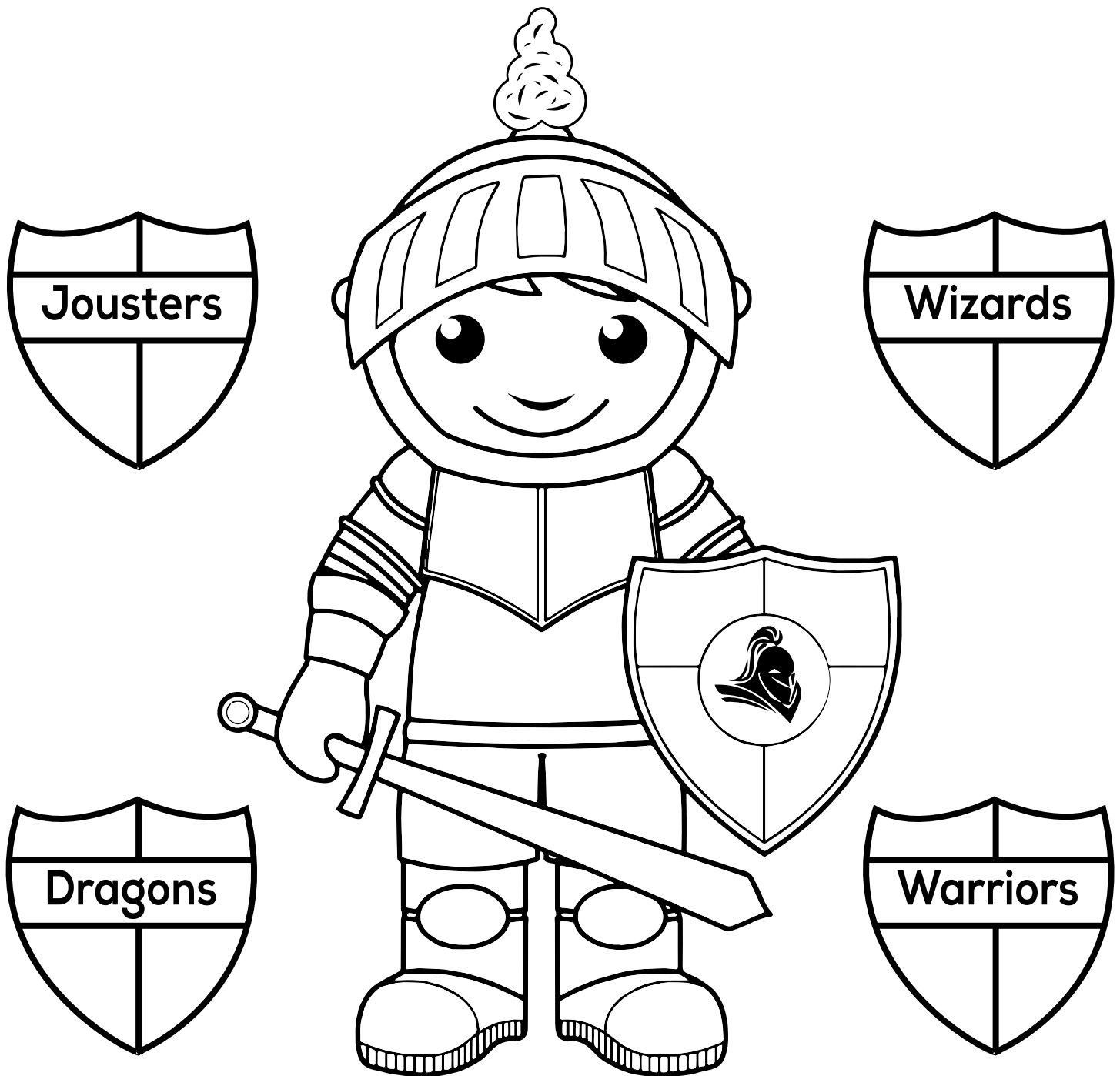

Helen E. Taylor School students, called 'knights', are divided among four houses.



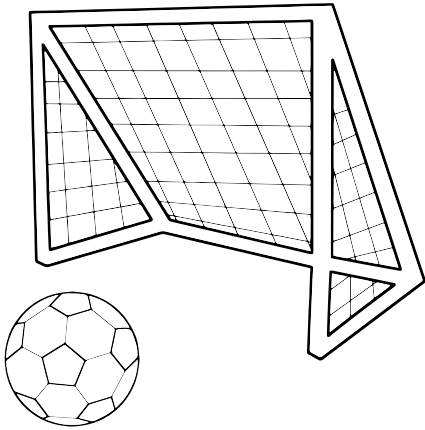

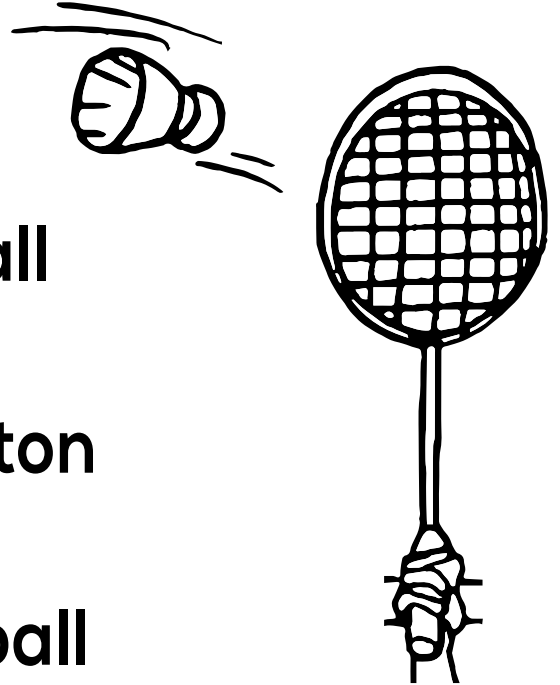

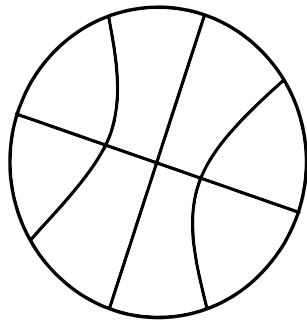

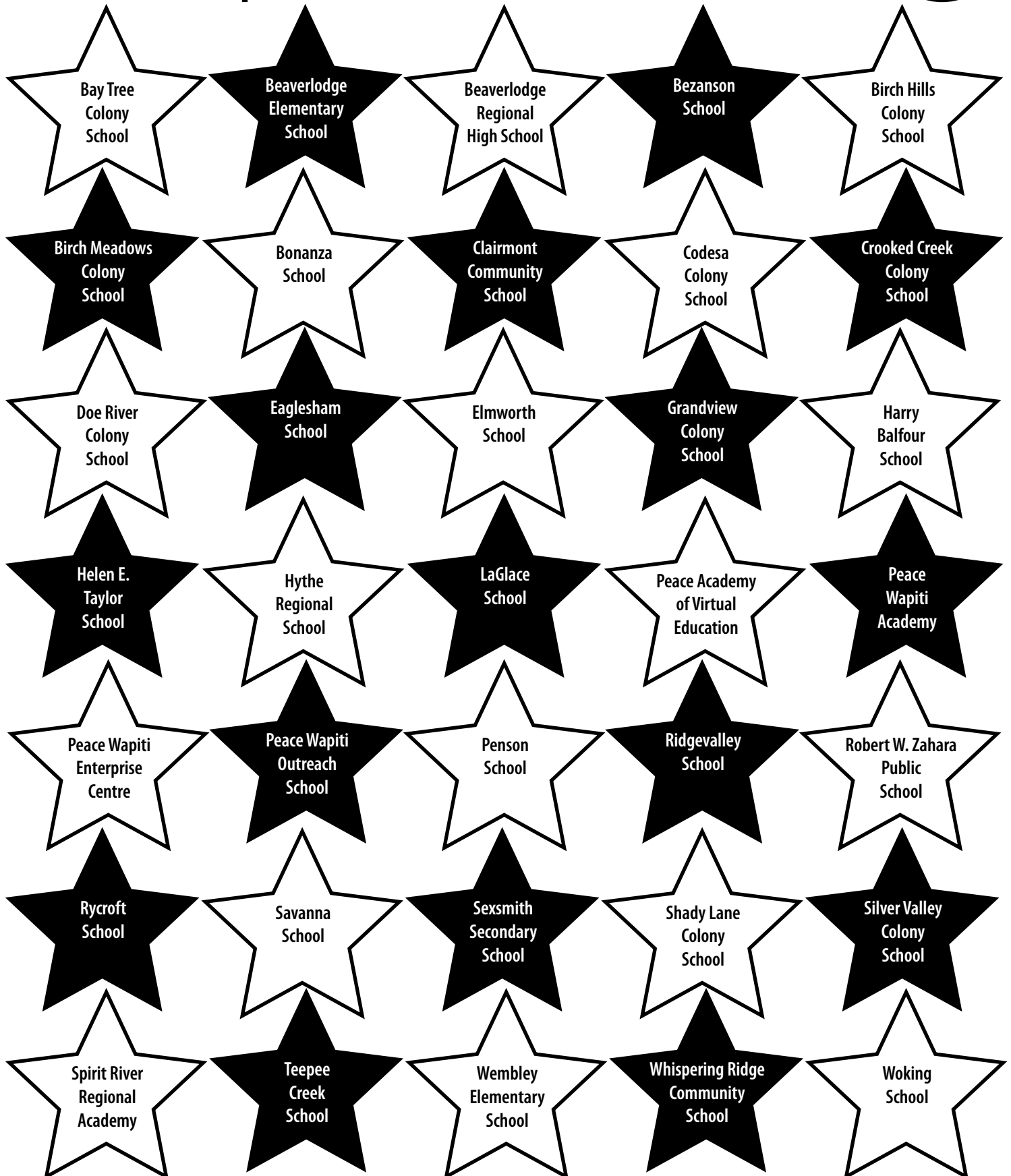
PWPSD manages one of the largest transportation systems in Alberta.



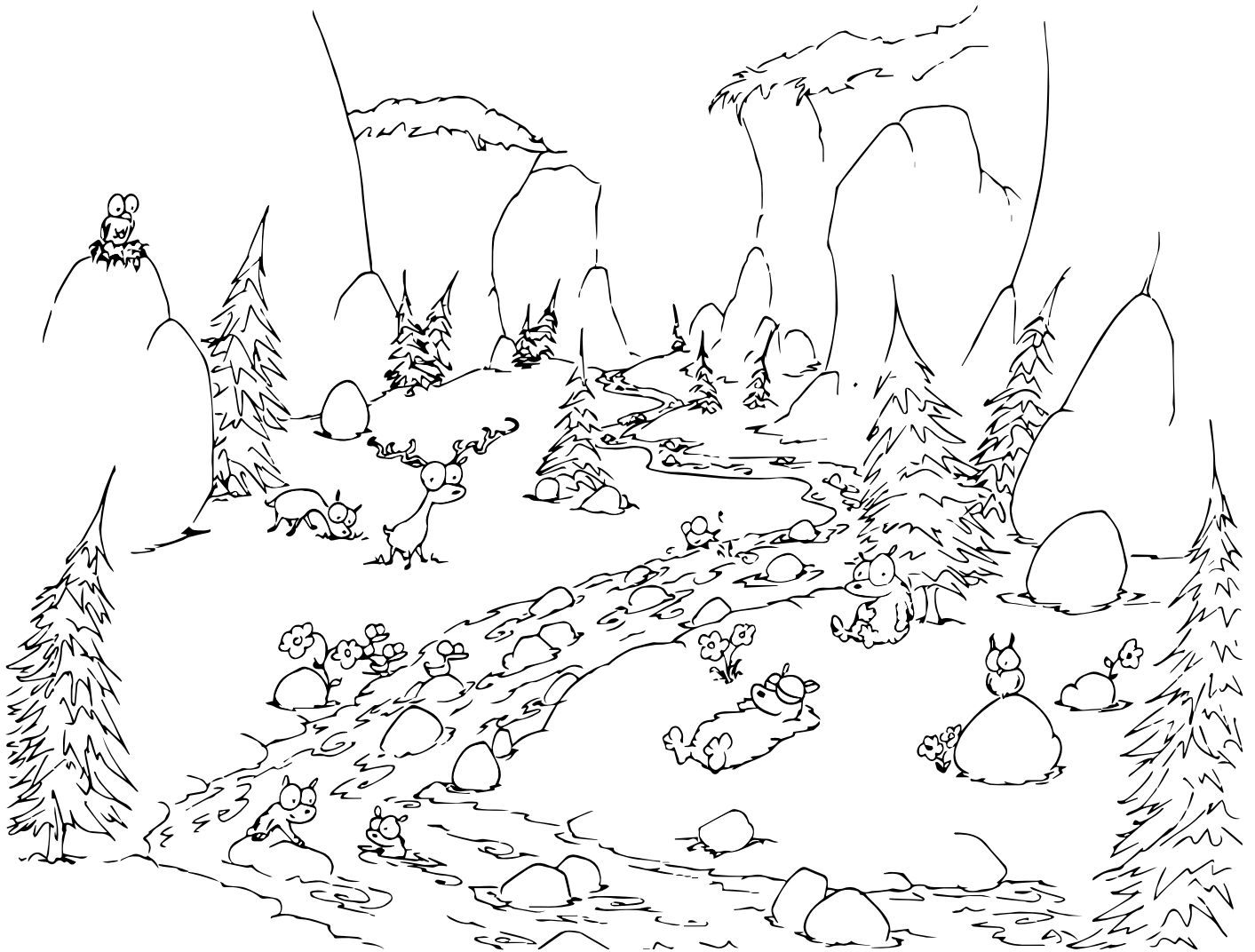
Each day, more than 100 bus drivers travel approximately 14,225 kilometres, transporting more than 4,000 students to schools in three school divisions.

Our name comes from the two
rivers that form the north and south
boundaries of our school division –
the Peace River and the Wapiti River.

Also, the Cree word 'wapiti' is used to
refer to elk.
