- NADC FNMI Return Service Agreement, Government of Alberta (\$10,000 annually)
- NIB Trust- Residential school survivors and their descendants (Amounts vary)
- Freehorse Family Wellness Centre- For off-reserve band members with Bill C-31 and Bill C-3 status (Tuition, books, and living allowance)
- Alberta Aboriginal Women's Society- Funding for short term programs and certificates
- Brosseau-Belcourt (Metis) Awards – For Metis students (\$1,000-\$10,000)
- Alberta Non-Status and Metis Human Services Funding (\$20,000 annually)
- TransAlta Aboriginal Bursary- Open to First Nations, Metis, and Inuit students
- Cenovus Aboriginal Scholarship Program- Open to First Nations, Metis and Inuit students
- Canada Post Aboriginal Education Incentive Awards- For students who have taken a year off school, and who have returned to complete their studies
- Altalink Aboriginal Scholarship- Open to First Nations, Metis, and Inuit students
- RBC Aboriginal Awards Program
- Indigenous Careers Award- Government of Alberta (\$4,000 annually)
- Inspire Awards- Amount varies, open to First Nations, Metis, and Inuit students
