GUIDELINES & PROCEDURES

1. The PAVE program offered must be authorized or approved by the Minister.
2. All course material, hardware and software required will be provided for the full program.
3. Progress reports will be issued bi-monthly with a final report to be prepared by the end of June of each school year.
4. Each student enrolled in the PAVE shall write all provincial mandated tests unless appropriate exemptions are obtained.
5. A PAVE student may attend any courses, programs or extra curricular activities at his/her resident school to compliment the virtual education program provided that:
 - a) the inclusion of the student within the program is supported by both the principal of PAVE and the principal of the residential school. Approval to participate shall not be unreasonably withheld;
 - b) the costs associated with the students involvement are the responsibility of the PAVE;
 - c) the student agrees to adhere to the resident school discipline policies;
 - d) in the case of extra-curricular sports, the PAVE Principal will inform (in writing) the NWASAA of students who will be participating in athletic events with the school in their attendance area, and provide a copy to the NWASAA of the resident Principals acceptance.
