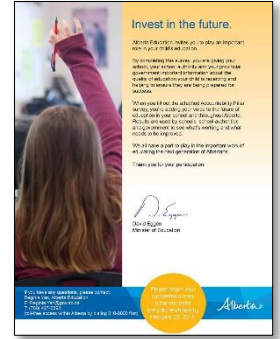

Accountability Pillar Survey Information

In January, parents of students in Grades 4, 7, and 10 in larger schools, and parents of students in Grades 4-12 in smaller schools, will receive Alberta Education's annual Accountability Pillar Survey in the mail. Teachers and students will complete the survey online at school. The goal of the survey is to collect information on the quality of education offered by our school. This is your opportunity to influence your child's education, simply by **completing and returning the survey by February 23, 2018**. Please take the time to read the following information to discover how your school is excelling in all seven areas outlined in the survey. **You may use this newsletter as a guide to assist you in completing the survey. 1. SAFE AND CARING SCHOOL ENVIRONMENT:

- We have cameras installed throughout the school.
- We deal with conflict between students and have them, if possible, to work to a guided resolution.
- We use positive reinforcement for good behaviour.
- All staff will be trained in NVCI and have current First Aid certificate.
- We use the zones of regulation in the elementary.
- Zones of Regulation information passed out to parents
- We are in the planning stages of an anxiety presentation for the younger students.
- Darrell Willier will be doing the Circle of Courage for all elementary students.
- Working with Birch Hills County to resolve the student crossing issue for town students walking to school.
- We have provided washroom facilities that are gender neutral.
- Making an effort to educate parents of the things we are doing to keep the school environment safe.
- PACE presentation was offered in the spring 2017.

2. ACCESS TO A BROAD PROGRAM OF STUDIES:

- We have provided junior high students with a workshop for using Google Chrome research. This will be provided shortly for senior high as well.
- More mini-workshops are planned for Google Apps and extensions for both junior and senior high students.
- We have provided Chrome Books at a reduced price for all junior and senior high students.
- Chrome Books are provided for grades 3 to 9 in class sets.
- We offered a workshop on test preparedness for junior and senior high students.
- Green Certificate
- Driver Education is being offered.
- We have had two FMNI presentations and a Distracted Drivers presentation.
- We are currently using LLI and Equals math program. We will be implementing the Leaps and Bounds math Program later on this year. Toe by Toe will be implemented

3. EDUCATIONAL QUALITY:

- We have analyzed PAT and DIP results.
- Teachers are working through exam tests and looking at areas where improvement is needed and providing a plan for this improvement. Will discuss these reviews with the Principals.

- Div 2 math teacher will be going to Bonanza to work with math 3/4 teacher
- Created a baseline for math using MIPI for all grade 2-10 students.
- MIPI brings attention to the areas of need for each specific student.
- Investing in Leaps and Bounds.
- Met with all high school students individually and discussed academic route to graduation.
- Met with all grade twelve students and their parents individually to review graduation requirements.
- We have created a variety of individual programs to meet the needs of our more challenged students.
