COURSE NAME	LEVEL	Possible CREDITS	DESCRIPTION
Aboriginal Studies	15	5 credits	This course offers 5 credits. The focal point of aboriginal studies is the wealth & diverse nature of aboriginal languages and culture.
AV Film Productions	10/20/30	module based - possible 16 credits	Work with a local production company to learn how to produce your own films and videos. NOTE: You must be enrolled in the Media Design class to take AV Film.
Career Directions	10/20/30	module based - maximum 3 credits	Expands career / life goals and transitioning to college using <i>myblueprint.ca</i>
Communication Technology	10/20	module based - maximum 5 credits	Learn elements & principles of design for various media. Camera uses & skills, basics of computer graphics, programs. Modules include: Visual Composition, Photo Intro, Learning Management Systems & Graphic Tools. Also Available: Animation & Web Design x2 modules. NOTE: Visual Composition is a pre-req for all other COM modules.
Community Care Services	30	module based-maximum 5 credits	Covers the importance of child care providers, effective communication, child development, daycare settings.
Community Leadership	10/20/30	15 credits	Incompasses mentorship, leadership & volunteerism. Become an active member of your community by learning to be a leader, dynamic speaker and volunteer. Projects can be based a students interests & passions.
Creative Writing	15/25	10 credits	Enjoy writing? This course offers everything from poetry to the proper formatting of a business letter.
Fashion Studies	10	module based - maximum 5 credits	From fashion illustration, to shopping to wearable art ... explore the world of fashion. Modules include: Fashion Dynamics, Fashion Illustrations, Sewing Fundamentals, Recycle/Redesign & Evolution of Fashion.
Financial Management	10/20	module based - maximum 5 credits	Deals with finances, code of conduct, financial resources, accounting & financial statements. Modules include: Personal Financial Management, Accounting Prep, Accounting Cycle 1, 2 and Spreadsheet 1.
First Aid (HCS2020; HCS3040)	20/30	2 credits	Students receive their St. John's Ambulance First Aid Certification. This is offered as a "One Credit Wonder" once each semester. NOTE: This course may NOT be used as part of 5 credits for a CONNECT block. It is ALWAYS done as over and above your regular class work. This may not be taken if a student receives credit for Outdoor Pursuits 10. This is a weekend course, offered on a Saturday & Sunday @ PWA
Forensic Science	25/35	8 credits	This course focuses on the collection, identification and analysis of crime scene evidence. Investigate techniques used in fingerprinting, handwriting analysis, ballistics, blood typing, hair and fiber examination, and DNA analysis. NOTE: Forensics 25 is a prereq for Forensics 35
Forestry	10, 20, 30	5 credits	The study of social, cultural, economic and environmental significance of forests. Modules include: Forests & Society, Forest Ecology in Canada, Forest use & Protection, Forest Protection & Stewardship & Forest Research & Development.
Google Academy	10,20	5 credits	This course deals with google drive and google apps. Modules include: Keyboarding, Spreadsheet 1, Digital Presentation, Word Processing 1 & 2.
IT Essentials/Network Admin.	10, 20, 30	10 credits	Covers the advance concepts of computer hardware & software. Deals with programming. Topics may include laptops, portable devices, security, wireless connectivity.
Kinesiology	10/20/30	16 credits	This course is module based with numerous modules available. Learn about health, wellness and nutrition. Take a closer look at our Muskuloskeletal & cardiovascular systems. This course is a great choice for anyone looking at a health related career, coaching/sports.
Languages	10/20/30	5 credits	Learn a second language! We offer French, Spanish, German & American Sign Language. NOTE: ASL 15/25 are offered in class, ASL 35 offered through CONNECT.
Legal Studies	10, 20, 30	module based - 5 credits	Legal Studies offers numerous modules dealing with all aspects of law. Some modules included are Employment Law, Environmental Law, Dispute Resolution.
Music Theory	25/35	3 credits each	Roughly equivalent to Royal Conservatory level Intermediate and Advanced. NOTE: This course can NOT be taken if extra-credit has already been awarded for music theory at these levels.
Paleontology	15	5 credits	Do you like dinosaurs? The main focus is to understand how fossil records assist scientists in developing theories of nature's response to change. NOTE: Paleo 15 is also part of the Science 20 class.
Psychology & Sociology	20/30	15 credits	Psychology courses available include: Personal, General, Abnormal, Experimental and Sociology.
Special Projects	10/20/30	5 credits	Students become involved in the selection, planning & organization of their own programs. Pursue activities in which you have interest or ability in!
Workplace Safety (HCS3000, HCS3010)	30	2 credits	This course deals with safety in the workplace. Students taking work experience must have this course. Offered during iplans and/or a full morning session.
