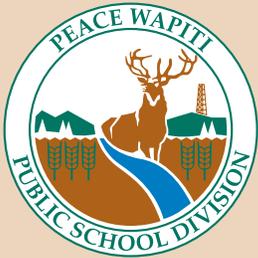

What the research says:

Staying on track for graduation

Researchers studied a group of Grade 9s and found that attendance in this transitional year was a key indicator of whether students would finish high school. The study also found attendance and studying more predictive of dropout than test scores or other student characteristics. In fact, Grade 9 attendance was a better predictor of dropout than Grade 8 results.

Missing one or two days per week doesn't seem like much, but...

If your child misses...	That equals...	Which is...	Over 13 years of schooling, that is...
1 day every 2 weeks	20 days per year	4 weeks per year	Nearly 1 ½ years
1 day per week	40 days per year	8 weeks per year	More than 2 ½ years
2 days per week	80 days per year	16 weeks per year	More than 5 years
3 days per week	120 days per year	24 weeks per year	Nearly 8 years

Even being 10 minutes late per day will affect your child...

10 min per day	50 min per week	Nearly 1 ½ weeks per year	Nearly ½ year
20 min per day	1 hour, 40 min per week	More than 2 ½ weeks per year	Nearly 1 year

1 hour per day	3 days per week	8 weeks per year	More than 2 ½ years
